The charges stemmed from a period between 1987 and 1989. when Dr. Lahoti was working at Cuba Memorial.

He is no longer affiliated with the hospital.

The doctor is charged with filing over 100 false claims with Medicaid, and receiving about \$3,000 in unlawful payments from the health care system.

Sources in Cuba Memorial said that Dr. Lahoti was a good doctor, and that he had been warned in the past about his billing practices.

Last week's arraignment came after the physician was indicted by an Allegany County Grand Jury. Dr. Lahoti was released on his own recognizance after the arraignment. He maintains that he is innocent of any wrongdoing.

Lake budget passed

CUBA--Cuba Lake cottage owners will be paying a bit more in taxes in

The Cuba Lake District Commissioners approved their 1992 budget last Thursday night (August 8). The budget calls for a 27% increase in the taxes on cottage owners in the district.

The increase is largely due to the cost of the negotiations and the rise in garbage collection costs, commissioners said. Only two cottage owners attended the public hearing on the budget, which preceded the vote. Neither of them chose to comment on the 1992 spending

to pay William Hennessy, an Albany lobbyist and former advisor to Governor Cuomo, to handle the negotiations between the state and the Cuba Lake District for the transfer of the lake.

Mr. Hennessy, formerly of Wellsville, has already been retained by the Cuba Lake District to handle the talks, and he was paid \$5,000 out of the Lake District's

1991 budget for his services. The state is seeking between \$8 and \$10 million for Cuba Lake; the Lake District and Mr. Hennessy will seek to whittle that figure down. At the present time the state owns the lake; the cottage owners lease their lots and own their cottages.

In other action August 8, the Lake District Commissioners:

· Agreed to pay for signs at lake boat launch sites warning about the danger of possible zebra mussel contamination. Lake officials are worried that the pesky mollusk, which is causing great economic damage in the Great Lakes, could be imported to Cuba Lake by a careless boater.

· Discussed the worsening traffic problems at the west end of the lake caused by growing Indianowned businesses on the Oil Springs Reservation.

· Noted that the Cuba Lake Cottage Owners Association (CLCOA) will be spending \$450 on sampling lake water. The money was received by the CLCOA in the form of a grant.

· Approved applications for the removal of trees at lot 261 and building of an addition and a new breakwall at cottage 37.


