AUCTION SALE ORDERED IN RUMSEY CASE

Seneca Falls, July 19.—Creditors of Rumsey Manufacturing Corp. have been issued an order to show cause why an order should not be granted authorizing J. Seward Bodine, Waterloo, assignee, to hold a public auction sale of all property and assets of the firm at 10:30 a. m. Aug. 1.

Order was issued by Seneca County Judge J. Willard Huff of Waterloo, and is returnable at a term of Seneca County court in the Waterloo courthouse Friday, Aug. 1, at 9:45 a. m.

If the public auction sale is not objected to, or if objection is made and over ruled, Judge Huff ordered, the auction will be held immediately afterward.

TO SHOW CAUSE
A similar order has been issued by Judge Huff to the matter of the general assignment of Rumsey Products, Inc., to J. Seward Bodine, for the benefit of its creditors. The order directs creditors of this concern, a subsidiary of the Rumsey Manufacturing corporation, to show cause at a term of county court in the Waterloo courthouse at 9:50 a. m. Friday, Aug. 1.

Further, Judge Huff ordered that all creditors of the companies present their claims, with vouchers, to Saperston, McNaughton and Saperston, Buffalo attorneys for Bodine, on or before Sept. 30, and that any creditor who fails to present his claim on or before that date, shall not participate in the assigned estate or receive any dividend on his claim.

CREDITORS GET NOTICE
Copies of Judge Huff's orders are being mailed to creditors whose names appear on the schedules of the assignees.

More than 350 men and women were thrown out of work at the Rumsey plants Tuesday with the filing of the general assignment for the benefit of its creditors in the office of the Seneca county clerk in Waterloo.

Ralph J. Rosen of Buffalo, has been named as auctioneer for the sale to be conducted at the plant here.
